FROM THE DIARY of a young Polish nun, a special devotion began spreading throughout the world in the 1930's. The message is not new, but is a reminder of what the Church has always taught through scripture and tradition: that God is merciful and forgiving and that we, too, must show mercy and forgiveness. But in the Divine Mercy devotion, the message takes on powerful new focus, calling people to a deeper understanding that God's love is unlimited and available to everyone – especially the greatest sinners. The message and devotion to Jesus as **The Divine Mercy** is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who wrote a diary recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. The Acronym, **F-I-N-C-H** is helpful in understanding how to tap into the graces of Divine Mercy. **“F”** is for the **Feast of Divine Mercy**, the eighth day in the Octave of Easter. The liturgical texts of this day, the 2nd Sunday of Easter, concern the institution of the Sacrament of Penance. **“I”** is for the **Image of Divine Mercy** (pictured above and at the front and to the right of the main altar), which Jesus requested, be venerated: *I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish.* **“N”** is for the **Novena to the Divine Mercy**. Jesus asked that the Feast of the Divine Mercy be preceded by a Novena to the Divine Mercy, which would begin on Good Friday. **“C”** is for the **Chaplet of Divine Mercy**. *“Say unceasingly this chaplet that I have taught you. Anyone who says it will receive great Mercy at the hour of death.* The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is prayed at Holy Name each Sunday after the 10:00 AM Mass. **“H”** is for the **Holy Hour**, (3:00 PM - when Christ died on the Cross). *At three o'clock, implore My mercy, especially for sinners; and, if only for a brief moment, immerse yourself in My Passion, particularly in My abandonment at the moment of agony. This is the hour of great mercy ... In this hour I will refuse nothing to the soul that makes a request of Me in virtue of My Passion.*
