PORZIUNCOLA PARDON - In this Jubilee Year of Mercy we celebrate the 800th anniversary of the Franciscan Feast of the Porziuncola Pardon. The Porziuncola "little church" is located inside the Papal Basilica of Saint Mary of the Angels in Assisi. It is a church dedicated by St. Francis to Mary, Mother of God. St. Francis of Assisi persuaded Pope Honorius III to grant [an] indulgence (elimination of temporal punishment due to sin) to all those who visited the Porziuncola on August 2 and confessed their sins. The Porziuncola is the cradle of the Franciscan Order, established as its headquarters by St. Francis himself. It is now possible to receive the indulgence at all Franciscan churches while meeting the conditions of Communion, Confession and praying for the Pope's intentions.

SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION - This year the Solemnity of the Assumption of our Blessed Mother into heaven, falls on Monday, Aug. 15, and therefore will *not* be a day of obligation. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has established that Days of Obligation that fall on Saturday, or Monday, are not to be observed as Days of Obligation. HOWEVER, because it is a Solemnity in the Liturgical Calendar, Holy Name Church will celebrate Mass at 12 Noon and 5:30 PM on Monday, August 15.

THAT MAN IS YOU! is an interactive, multimedia men's program focused upon the development of authentic male leadership. **That Man is You!** successively considers men in their relationship to God, to their spouse and to their children. ST. MAXIMILIAN KOLBE - Next Sunday, August 14, will mark the 75th anniversary of the martyrdom of Franciscan Friar Conventual, St. Maximilian Kolbe. Also being celebrated is the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Militia of the Immaculata by Fr. Kolbe.

St. Maximilian died on August 14, 1941 at Auschwitz Concentration Camp in German occupied Poland. He had volunteered to die of starvation in place of a fellow prisoner who had a wife and children. As Maximilian and his fellow prisoners faded away, he comforted them through prayer. After 14 days, the prisoners had died while Maximilian remained alive.
