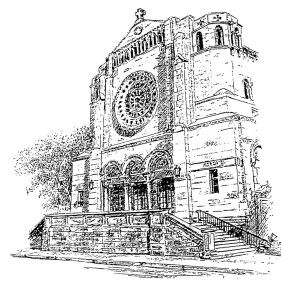

THE MONTH OF DECEMBER in the Roman Catholic Church is devoted to the Immaculate Conception. Here is a beautiful prayer by St. Ephrem: *O pure and immaculate and likewise blessed Virgin, who art the sinless Mother of thy Son, the mighty Lord of the universe, thou who art inviolate and altogether holy, the hope of the hopeless and sinful, we sing thy praises. We bless thee, as full of every grace, thou who didst bear the God-Man: we all bow low before thee; we invoke thee and implore thine aid. Rescue us, O holy and inviolate Virgin, from every necessity that presses upon us and from all the temptations of the devil. Be our intercessor and advocate at the hour of death and judgement; deliver us from the fire that is not extinguished and from the outer darkness; make us worthy of the glory of thy Son, O dearest and most clement Virgin Mother. Thou indeed art our only hope, most sure and sacred in God's sight, to whom be honor and glory, majesty and dominion, for ever and ever, world without end. Amen.*

ADVENT REFRESHER - Another Advent tradition is praying the *O Antiphons* from the Liturgy of the Hours in the eight days leading up to Christmas. The O Antiphons are the antiphons of the Evening Prayers (Vespers) during the week before Christmas. Each antiphon welcome the birth of the Savior by heralding one of the resplendent Biblical titles of the soon-to-be-born Son of God as foreshadowed in the Old Testament by the prophet Isaiah.

CATHOLIC FOUNDATION GRANT TO HELP HOLY NAME - As many of you know, our aging buildings are often in need of repair. One of the challenges we face in repairing or updating the buildings is the presence of asbestos. At one time, asbestos was used to insulate the pipes in the heating system. The Catholic Foundation has generously awarded the Parish a \$3000 grant to help us pay for removing some of the asbestos. This will not only help us complete some needed repairs, but also make improvements easier. REJOICE IN THE LORD ALWAYS. I SHALL SAY IT REJOICE!

The third Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete Sunday. Its name is taken from the entrance antiphon of the Mass, which you see above. This is a quotation from Philippians 4:4-5. In Latin, the first word of the antiphon is *gaudete* (Latin "rejoice"); it's also pronounced with three syllables: *gau-de-te* Advent is the season of preparing for the arrival of the Lord Jesus (both his first coming and his second coming), and by the third Sunday of Advent, we are most of the way through the season. Thus it is appropriate to rejoice as we see the goal of the season approaching: "The Lord is near." Advent is a penitential season thus the color is purple. On Gaudete Sunday, we dispense with the purple in favor of the color rose. The pink advent candle is lit. Thus we symbolize a feeling of rejoicing.
