SATURDAY, DECEMBER 8, IS A HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION! We will be celebrating the feast of the Immaculate Conception. A persistent confusion seems to exist over the "Immaculate Conception." Some people mistakenly think the term is related to Mary's conception of Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit. However, the Immaculate Conception is the belief that "the most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and in view of the merits of Christ Jesus the Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin..." (Ineffabilis Deus). Our Blessed Mother's conception of Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit - is known as the Feast of the Annunciation and is on March 25: 9 months before Christmas!! Mass times at Holy Name Church will be as follows: Friday, Dec. 7, vigil Mass at 5:30 PM. Saturday, Dec. 8, Mass will be at 8:30 AM

THE MONTH OF DECEMBER in the Roman Catholic Church is devoted to the Immaculate Conception. "We declare, pronounce and define that the doctrine which holds that the Blessed Virgin Mary, at the first instant of her conception, by a singular privilege and grace of the Omnipotent God, in virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Savior of mankind, was preserved immaculate from all stain of original sin, has been revealed by God, and therefore should firmly and constantly be believed by all the faithful." **ADVENT REFRESHER** - For Catholics of the Roman Rite, Advent, the period of preparation for Christmas, begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas. Advent is a period of preparation. The word Advent comes from the Latin advenio, "to come to," and refers to the coming of Christ. This refers, first of all, to our celebration of Christ's birth at Christmas; but second, to the coming of Christ in our lives through grace and the Sacrament of Holy Communion; and finally, to His second coming at the end of time. Our preparations, therefore, should have all three comings in mind. We need to prepare our souls to receive Christ worthily. Traditionally, all great feasts have been preceded by a time of fasting, which makes the feast itself more joyful. Advent as in Lent, should be marked by increased prayer, fasting, and good works. The Western Church no longer has a set requirement for fasting during Advent. But we can all voluntarily choose to do something to prepare for Christ, so that when Christmas Day finally arrives, we may find that our fast has increased the joy of our feast. (thoughtco.com)

THE ADVENT WREATH is one of the most beloved of all Advent devotions. It consists of an evergreen wreath and four candles (traditionally, three purple candles and one rose one). In the first week of Advent, one purple candle is lit. In the second week of Advent, two purple candles are lit. In the third week of Advent (beginning with Gaudete Sunday), two purple candles and one rose candle are lit. In the fourth week, all four candles are lit.
