(Matthew 5:48)

We may at first be cowed by this daunting command. But this command must be read in the context of the whole passage which begins with another command: *But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust.* (Matthew 5:44)

In Greek, the word often translated as "perfect" is "telios." It refers to something being completed, brought to its full potential and intended end and vocation. For example, in the world of objects, a hammer is telios or perfect when it is hammering a nail. In the world of subjects, things are telios or perfect when they are fulfilling their nature.

The God who is Love fashioned us in His Image. We are made to love as He loves. In Jesus Christ, we are now also being made capable - by the grace of His Redemption - of actually loving with God's love.
