### “GIVING UP SOMETHING FOR LENT”

When many of us were children, we might remember our giving up candy for Lent. And, it seemed like a real sacrifice. As we grew up, it was often more difficult to decide what special thing to do, - to get our attention and to prepare ourselves for deeper sacrifices.

The question to ask is: What would make me grow in freedom? For some of us, it could be committing ourselves to give up judging others. For others, it could be giving up screen time from our smart phones, computers, and television. For many of us, the choice may not be to give something up, but to add something to our daily lives during Lent. We may commit ourselves to extra prayer time. Maybe we could do some spiritual reading on a daily basis. We may decide to attend Mass during the week. We may choose to increase our almsgiving to the poor - perhaps related to something we choose not to do, e.g., some might choose not to go out to eat one night a week, and to give that total amount to the poor. Whether it is fasting, abstaining or other acts of penance, the whole desire we should have is to use these means to help us grow closer to our Lord and prepare ourselves "to celebrate the paschal mystery with minds and hearts renewed." (First Preface of Lent) -From onlineministries.Creighton.edu

**LENTEN FAST AND ABSTINENCE** - During Lent, Catholics in the United States *abstain* from meat on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. They *fast* on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The law of abstinence and fast binds all Catholics who have completed their fourteenth year, and adults up to their sixtieth year during Lent.

To abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent means to not eat meat on those days. (Eggs and dairy are permitted)

The required fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday involves eating only one full meal on those days. One or two smaller meals may be taken on those days, but may not total one full meal. The required fast does not allow eating anything between meals.

*Rest in God alone, my soul. (Psalm 62)*

*Please remember our priests and seminarians in your prayers. Continue to pray for an increase of vocations to the priesthood and religious life.*

**ASH WEDNESDAY MASS** will be celebrated at Holy Name Church at 12:00 Noon and at 5:30 PM on Ash Wednesday.

**THE FIRST FOUR DAYS OF LENT** - These days serve as an introduction to our Lenten journey. Before we begin the first full week of Lent, we have a powerful set of readings about our Prayer, Repentance, Almsgiving and Fasting. We place ashes on our foreheads and learn about the meaning of death and life. Over two days we pray over the powerful challenge of Isaiah 58. And Jesus reminds us that he is inviting us to a "change of heart." Pay attention to these first four days!

**ASH WEDNESDAY COLLECTION** - The Ash Wednesday collection will benefit the Joint Organization for Inner-city Needs (JOIN), which operates under Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Columbus. JOIN provides emergency assistance to the vulnerable of Franklin and surrounding counties in the form of food, prescription help, utilities, infant needs, identification papers, transportation, eyeglasses, burial assistance, senior items and referrals to other service providers.
