**OPERATION RICE BOWL** - More than 40 years ago, Catholics in the United States wanted to respond to famine in Africa. Could people who were hungry and starving be helped through Lenten prayers, fasting and almsgiving? The answer came in the form of a small cardboard box, marking the beginning of "Operation Rice Bowl" In 1977, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops voted to make Operation Rice Bowl the official program of Catholic Relief Services. The tool for collecting your Lenten alms is a cardboard or homemade CRS Rice Bowl. The CRS Rice Bowl app, (available for both Android and Apple devices) allows you to also create a *virtual* Rice Bowl. Seventy-five percent of gifts support CRS' humanitarian programs around the world, 25 percent of gifts remain in each U.S. diocese where they are given for hunger and poverty alleviation efforts in those communities.
