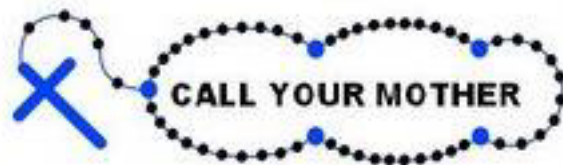

**NEW BISHOP** - The Vatican has accepted the resignation and retirement of Bishop Frederick Campbell as Bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Columbus and appointed Bishop Robert Brennan as the 12<sup>th</sup> bishop of Columbus. Bishop Brennan comes to Columbus after serving as the Auxiliary Bishop of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, New York.
