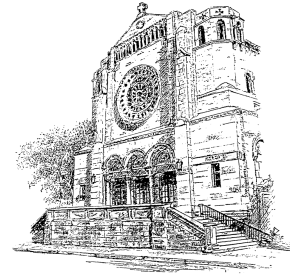

THINGS TO DO FOR LENT!

These ideas are coming to you a bit early, but it's good to plan ahead. You probably know that the three pillars of Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Did you know that you're supposed to do all three? Did you know that you can do more than one thing in each category? Lent is not the time to go so hard that you die—or make others wish they were dead because you're so cranky. It's a time to discern what the Lord is calling you to, what he wants you to be more detached from, what sin he's calling you to abandon, how he wants you to lean on him and love his children. But it can be hard sometimes to come up with something more fruitful than giving up sweets. Here are some options.

Fasting from: gossip, complaining, pornography, drinking, judging people, immodest clothing, cursing, impure TV, movies, books and music, snacking, Facebook, social media, wasting time on the internet...

Prayer should be at the center of your life all the time, but especially during Lent. Try one of these this Lent: Attend daily Mass, read all 4 Gospels by reading 2 chapters/day, pray daily Rosary, do 20 min. of spiritual reading/day, wear a crucifix, pray the Stations of the Cross every Friday, read the lives of the saints, subscribe to a Catholic blog...

Almsgiving isn't always as easy as giving money to the poor. Figure out how you need to love the people around you better. Visit a nursing home, participate in CRS rice bowl, volunteer at the local soup kitchen, perform an act of charity every day, donate money you'd normally spend on yourself, have a Mass said for someone, invite a priest to dinner...
