REFLECTION ON ABORTION - On January 22, our nation will mark the 43rd anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*, the Supreme Court decision that made abortion legal throughout the U.S. Since that tragic decision, more than 56 million children's lives have been lost to abortion, and many suffer that loss -- often in silence. The Catholic Church teaches that the right to life of every innocent human individual is an inalienable one. The Catechism of the Catholic Church draws on the Bible, the Mass, the sacraments, Church tradition and teaching, and the lives of the saints. That makes it a profound resource for our spiritual journey. The following is excerpted from the Catechism:

2270 Human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception. From the first moment of his existence, a human being must be recognized as having the rights of a person - among which is the inviolable right of every innocent being to life.

Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you (Jer. 1:5)

My frame was not hidden from you, when I was being made in secret, intricately wrought in the depths of the earth. (Ps. 139:15)

2271 Since the first century the Church has affirmed the moral evil of every procured abortion. This teaching has not changed and remains unchangeable. Direct abortion, that is to say, abortion willed either as an end or a means, is gravely contrary to the moral law:

You shall not kill the embryo by abortion and shall not cause the newborn to perish (Didache 2,2:ÆCh 248,148; cf. Ep. Barnabae 19,5:PG 2 777; Ad D 5,6:PG 2,1173; Tertullian, Apol. 9:PL 1,319-320.)

God, the Lord of life, has entrusted to men the noble mission of safeguarding life, and men must carry it out in a manner worthy of themselves. Life must be protected with the utmost care from the moment of conception: abortion and infanticide are abominable crimes (GS 51 § 3.)
