During the Fortnight, our liturgical calendar celebrates a series of great martyrs who remained faithful in the face of persecution by political power – St. John the Baptist, SS. Peter and Paul, the First Martyrs of the Church of Rome, St. John Fisher, and St. Thomas More. Through prayer, study, and peaceful public action during the Fortnight for Freedom, we hope to remind everyone throughout the United States of the importance of preserving the fundamental right of religious freedom. 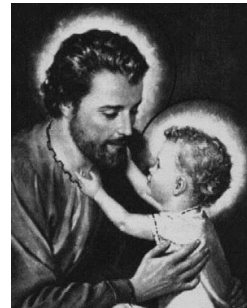

THE MONTH OF JUNE is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. “*The Heart of Jesus is the ultimate symbol of God’s mercy; but it is not an imaginary symbol, it is a real symbol, which represents the center, the source from which salvation for all humanity gushed forth.*” (Pope Francis)

TRUE OR FALSE? If you receive only the Sacred Host at Communion, you are receiving *just* the body of Christ. “False!” The whole and entire Christ is contained in the smallest particle of the Sacred Host or drop of Precious Blood.

One of the most beautiful and intimate ways we participate in the Mass is through the reception of Holy Communion, the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. The *General Instruction on the Roman Missal* asserted the “meaning” of Communion is most clearly signified when given under both *species*— both the Sacred Host and the Precious Blood. Here the imagery of receiving the Body and Blood of Christ, of being joined with the Messianic Banquet, becomes most clear (#240). However, no where has the Church mandated that both species must be offered.

We must remember that “the whole and entire Christ and the true sacrament are received under either species” (Council of Trent, *Doctrine on Communion Under Both Species and on Communion of Little Children*). If one receives **EITHER** the Precious Blood, or the Sacred Host, (or both), one receives Jesus Christ; body, blood, soul and divinity and the fullness of the grace of the sacrament.
