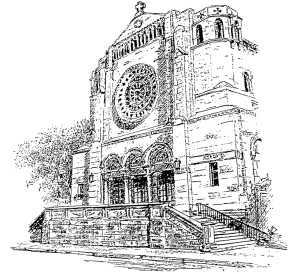

FORTNIGHT FOR FREEDOM - The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) suggest that the fourteen days from June 21—the vigil of the Feasts of St. John Fisher and St. Thomas More—to July 4, Independence Day, be dedicated to a "fortnight for freedom"—a great hymn of prayer for our country. Our liturgical calendar celebrates a series of great martyrs who remained faithful in the face of persecution by political power—St. John Fisher and St. Thomas More, St. John the Baptist, SS. Peter and Paul, and the First Martyrs of the Church of Rome. To all our fellow Catholics, we urge an intensification of your prayers and fasting for the protection of our God given and Constitutional right to religious freedom.

PRAY TO PROTECT RELIGIOUS FREEDOM - As part of the national Fortnight for Freedom, a special Mass and Holy Hour for Religious Freedom will be celebrated on Wednesday, June 29, 5:15 p.m., at Saint Joseph Cathedral. The Mass will conclude with a special Holy Hour beginning with a rosary for Religious Freedom and Liberty, followed by silent Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and concluding with Benediction. All are invited to join us.

UNDERSTANDING THE MASS

(Fourth in a series)

THE GOSPEL - The high point of the Liturgy of the Word is the reading of the Gospel. In the first reading, God spoke through his prophets, in the second through his Apostles, and now **in the Gospel God speaks directly through His son Jesus Christ. It is the most important time of the liturgy of the word.** Because the Gospels tell of the life, ministry, and preaching of Christ, it receives several special signs of honor and reverence. The gathered assembly stands to hear the Gospel and it is introduced by an acclamation of praise. Apart from Lent, that acclamation is "Alleluia," derived from a Hebrew phrase meaning "Praise the Lord!" The word Gospel means "good news" and this good news is not just a message, it is Jesus himself! The best news that ever existed! The priest or deacon proclaims the Gospel. To begin, we make the sign of the cross on the forehead, mouth and chest to symbolize that we receive the word of God in our mind, we confess it with our mouth, and we keep it in our heart.

THE HOMILY - We need to both hear and understand the word of God. After the Scripture readings, the celebrant gives the homily. "Homily" comes from a Greek word meaning "dialogue" or "conversation". In the homily, the priest focuses on the Scripture texts or some other texts from the liturgy, drawing from them lessons that may help us to live better lives, more faithful to Christ's call to grow in holiness.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE NEW MASS SCHEDULE OF HOLY NAME PARISH AND PARROQUIA SANTA CRUZ

Several years ago the Diocese of Columbus created a long range planning committee to evaluate future parish requirements including manpower, finances, priest demographics and availability of potential priests.

The aging facilities, maintenance costs, and decline in church attendance has affected a number of our parishes in the Diocese. Last year our Diocese was in the red on their operating budget, and this has affected a number of smaller parishes. Holy Name parish has been declining in size and is one of the smallest parishes. Fortunately Santa Cruz, the Latino parish here at Holy Name, has been growing rapidly.

At a time when the Diocese is contemplating eliminating some parishes we have been asked to combine the pastoral work of both parishes. This includes the shared spaces of church, undercroft, and parking lot. I feel we are very fortunate to be able to continue to maintain both parishes under one roof.

After prayer and after consulting some other brother priests from Parishes that went through similar change, I met with a number of the Holy Name parishioners and explained a plan to better serve both parishes.

Considering the number of people attending Masses on Sunday which means between 900 and 1,000 people from Santa Cruz versus 200 people from Holy Name where almost 50% are transient students, based on logistics which include lack of space in the parking lot, the need of additional classrooms for Sunday religious education, I realize the impossibility to keep three morning Masses in the same Church. I am forced to make a change that will impact both parishes. From the first Sunday of August the 10:00 AM Mass will be discontinued. I am sorry for the inconvenience that the change will cause to some of our parishioners and I appreciate the openness and understanding of all. Listed below, you will find the new mass schedules for both parishes.
