**CONFESSIONS ARE HEARD** at Holy Name Sunday through Friday one hour before Mass at 5:30 and on Saturday 10 AM to 12 noon.

**LENTEN FAST AND ABSTINENCE** – Now that we are beyond Ash Wednesday we *abstain* from meat on all the Fridays of Lent. (Eggs and dairy are permitted) Catholics are required to fast on Good Friday. Fasting involves eating only one full meal on that day. One or two smaller meals may be taken, but may not total one full meal. The required fast does not allow eating anything between meals. The law of abstinence and fast binds all Catholics who have completed their fourteenth year, and adults up to their sixtieth year.

### LENTEN REFLECTION

Every Lent the Church invites us to consider the three traditional practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. We hope that this reflection might be a helpful guide to increasing the practice of prayer this Lent.

In the area of prayer, there is a question that we need to ask ourselves: "Is the media that I am using drawing me closer to God or away from God?" What do I find myself watching on TV? What do I listen to on the way to work? What am I surfing for online? How often am I on my smart phone, or iPad, or Kindle? What relationships am I forming on Facebook? Are these devices drawing me toward God or taking me away from God? Lent is a time for us to turn back to God — if the screen time we are choosing is not drawing us toward God, maybe it's a good time to evaluate some alternatives. Great Catholic apps can be found for your iPod, Android or Blackberry. Just go to the App Store or Market and search "Catholic." You will find an abundance of apps that will help with everything from learning how to pray the rosary to preparing for Confession. Some examples are: "iBreviary," "Confession," and "Rosary." Kindle has numerous writings of the saints for free including those of: St. Francis de Sales: (Introduction to the Devout Life), St. Therese: (The Story of a Soul), and many others (Search: Catholic or Saint). Please consider downloading at least one "prayer app" to help you grow in prayer this Lent.

Consider buying the Catechism of the Catholic Church at any Catholic bookstore. The section on prayer is some of the richest and most inspiring you will find anywhere. The Catechism can also be found online, and there are several apps, which offer the catechism such as the app "Laudate."
