ELECTION DAY – TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 7. - In the Catholic Tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation. Catholic voters are called to properly form their consciences in preparation for voting and for the continued advocacy for just laws and policies required after voting. This process should focus on moral principles, the defense of life, the needs of the weak, and the pursuit of the common good. PRAY FOR THE HOLY SOULS IN PURGATORY – In November, we recall our deceased loved ones in a special way. The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that "death puts an end to human life as the time open to either accepting or rejecting the divine grace manifested in Christ. (1021: 2 Tm 1:9-10) The Holy Souls are those "who die in God's grace and friendship" but who are "still imperfectly purified... After death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven" (CCC 1030) Part of the joy of belonging to the Church is the privilege of helping the Holy Souls to enter heaven. The Church commends prayers, almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead." (CCC 1032) Saint Augustine assures us, "It cannot be doubted that the prayers of the Church relieve the Holy Souls, and move God to treat them with more clemency than their sins deserve." (*Magnificat, Nov. 2017*)
