The Latin word Tenebrae means “darkness” - the struggle between the dark forces of sin that seem to extinguish the Light of the World, Jesus Christ. Consider attending this beautiful ritual of prayers, psalms and music, to enhance your observance of Holy Week.

FATIMA: ROSARY FOR PEACE – Between May and October, 1917, our Blessed Mother appeared to 3 shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal. She called for the daily praying of the Rosary to obtain peace in the world. As the 100 year Anniversary of the apparitions approaches, Holy Name will be praying the Holy Rosary 24/7. We need volunteers to commit to praying the Rosary each hour of the day. You can do this at home, in your car, or wherever you find yourself. There will be a sign up sheet in the vestibule.

HOLY LAND GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION - Parishes around the world this week will be taking up the traditional Good Friday Collection for the Church in the Holy Land. The proceeds from the Good Friday Collection go to the Franciscan Custody of the Holy Land. The Franciscans have been caring for the holy sites there since 1209. They also assist the poor, run schools, provide scholarships, and conduct pastoral ministries to keep Christianity alive in the land where it originated. Please consider a generous donation.

THE SACRED TRIDUUM - Sundown on Holy Thursday to sundown on Easter Sunday is considered the most solemn part of the liturgical year. This three-day period is referred to as the *Easter Triduum*, also known as the *Sacred Triduum*, or *Paschal Triduum*. Basically, the Sacred Triduum is one great festival recounting the last three days of Jesus' life on earth, the events of his Passion and Resurrection, when the Lamb of God laid down his life in atonement for our sins.

It is known as the “Paschal Mystery” because it is the ultimate fulfillment of the ancient Jewish Passover (or Pasch), which itself was a recollection of how God brought the Jews out of their slavery in Egypt. The spotless lamb was slaughtered at the Passover meal and consumed, and that night the destroying angel “passed over” the homes marked with the blood of the Passover Lamb, and those covered by the Blood were saved. This was the Old Testament prefigurement of Jesus' work at the Last Supper—where he inserted himself as the Paschal Lamb—and Calvary, where the sacrifice was offered to save us from our slavery to sin. With the Holy Eucharist, we consume the victim that died for our sins.

The Paschal Mystery is, therefore, God's plan of redemption for the fallen human race through the Passion, death, and resurrection of God-man, Jesus Christ.

HOLY WEEK is filled with some of the richest and most ancient symbols of the Catholic faith. The waving of palms reminds us that we are called to be followers of Jesus, not fans who cheer from a distance. The washing of feet speaks to us of the selfless love that we are called to practice in imitation of Jesus. The veneration of the cross on Good Friday reminds us that we believe Jesus can overcome even death. The lighting of the Easter fire in a darkened church at the Easter Vigil, speaks to us of a new life because of Jesus' triumph over the darkness of sin and death.
