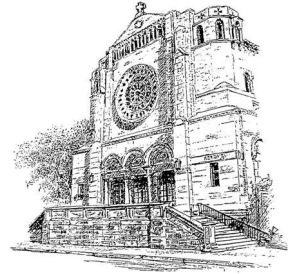

"Fatima" is a fact-based drama which recounts what may rank as the most remarkable series of religious events of modern times. The apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima have generated more devotion than any other Church-approved Marian apparition.
