AUGUST IS DEVOTED TO THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY. As Pope John Paul II said, “We see symbolized in the Heart of Mary her maternal love, her singular sanctity and her central role in the redemptive mission of her Son” (Sept. 22, 1986). Benedict XVI notes: “In Biblical language, the ‘heart’ indicates the center of human life, the point where reason, will, temperament and sensitivity converge, where the person finds his unity and his interior orientation. According to Matt 5:8, the ‘immaculate heart’ is a heart which, with God’s grace, has come to the perfect interior unity and therefore ‘sees God.’ “To be ‘devoted’ to the Immaculate Heart of Mary means therefore to embrace this attitude of heart, which makes the fiat—‘your will be done’—the defining center of one’s whole life” (Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger (Theological Commentary on the Third Secret of Fatima). –stthomasmore.org

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY - On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith: “We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory.” The pope proclaimed this dogma only after a broad consultation of bishops, theologians and laity. What the pope solemnly declared was already a common belief in the Catholic Church. We find homilies on the Assumption going back to the sixth century. By the 13th century there was universal agreement on this doctrine of faith. The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is Saturday, August 15. This is normally a Holy Day of Obligation for all Catholics. **The vigil Mass will be August 14, at 5:30 PM. The Mass on the Solemnity will be at 8:30 AM on Saturday, August 15.**

LEBANON’S CATHOLIC LEADERS SEEK HELP - As Lebanon’s Catholic leaders appealed for help for their country, international and U.S. organizations appealed for donations for Beirut, capital of a country already suffering from a severe economic downturn. In Lebanon, Maronite Catholics are the largest Christian group. In the United States, two Maronite bishops noted that the explosions, which left more than 130 people dead and more than 300,000 homeless, “turned Beirut into an apocalyptic city. Hospitals, schools, houses, businesses, and much more (are) destroyed, leaving people feeling hopeless and helpless... We urge you to pray for Lebanon, and we ask for your support for our brothers and sisters at this difficult time and in response to this catastrophe.” signed by Bishops Gregory Mansour of the Eparchy of St. Maron of Brooklyn and A. Elias Zaidan of the Eparchy of Our Lady of Lebanon of Los Angeles.
