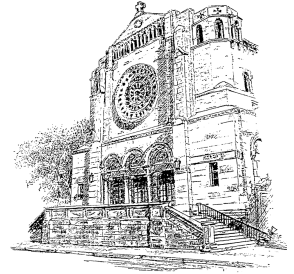

THE HOLY DOOR – The Jubilee Year of Mercy is an Extraordinary Holy Year that officially commenced on December 8th – the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception – with the opening of the Holy Door or Porta Sancta, in St. Peter’s Basilica. Pilgrims and Penitents pass through the Holy Door as a gesture of leaving the past behind and crossing the threshold from sin to grace, from darkness to light. The door finds meaning only when the believer associates the door with Christ. Jesus is the Door! In the words of Pope Francis, “There is only one way that opens wide the entrance into the life of communion with God: this is Jesus, the one and absolute way to salvation.” In our own Diocese, the designated Holy Door is at St. Joseph Cathedral. Today Bishop Campbell will open the Holy Door reinaugurating the Year of Mercy for the Diocese of Columbus. *Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. (Luke 6:36)*

WHAT IS GAUDETE SUNDAY? Gaudete Sunday is the 3rd Sunday of Advent. The introit or entrance antiphon sung at Mass is taken from Philippians 4:4-5: “*Gaudete in Domino semper*” (“Rejoice in the Lord, Always”) Advent is the season of preparing for the arrival of the Lord Jesus (both his first coming and his second coming), and by the third Sunday of Advent, we are most of the way through the season. The priestly vestments as well as the advent candle change from the penitential purple to the encouragement of the color rose. It is appropriate to rejoice: “*The Lord is near.*”

Please remember our priests and seminarians in your prayers. Continue to pray for an increase of vocations to the priesthood and religious life.
