THE MONTH OF DECEMBER is traditionally dedicated to the Immaculate Conception. The Blessed Virgin Mary, according to the teaching of the Catholic Church, **in the first moment of her conception, by a singular privilege of Almighty God**, and by virtue of the foreseen merits of Jesus Christ, our Saviour and hers, **was preserved from all stain of original sin**. The Catholic Church teaches that Mary was conceived by normal biological means in the womb of her mother, Saint Anne, but God acted upon her soul, keeping it "immaculate". Although the belief that Mary was conceived with an immaculate soul, has been held since Late Antiquity, the doctrine was dogmatically defined in 1854, by Pope Pius IX. This year the Solemnity of The Immaculate Conception falls on the Second Sunday of Advent. The solemnity is therefore transferred to the following day. The obligation to attend Mass, however, does not transfer.



NOVENA FOR THE SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION - Beginning Friday, November 29, thru Dec. 6, the Prayer of the Rosary will be said after 5:30 PM weekday Masses and at regularly scheduled times on Saturdays and Sunday for Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception.
