FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT - Today is the fourth Sunday of Advent. On the fourth week of Advent, we light the final purple candle to mark the final week of prayer and penance as we wait for the birth of our Savior. This final candle, the "Angel's Candle," symbolizes peace. As we read today's scriptures, the virtue of courage is seemingly at the center of these passages. Courage is the cardinal virtue that enables us to stand firm even in the face of difficulties. Courage enables us to resist temptation and also helps us to change the habits that we need to change so that we become better people. If we are to live our Christian lives well, we need the good habit of courage. So on this last Sunday, as we await the coming of Christ, perhaps both the good news and our moral exhortation is: **Take courage!** (catholicmoraltheology.com)
