SOLEMNITY: MARY, MOTHER OF GOD

*New Year's Eve – Thursday, December 31
Vigil Mass: 5:30 PM*

New Year's Day – Friday, January 1: 5:30 PM



THE SOLEMNITY OF MARY, MOTHER OF GOD is a
liturgical celebration observed on January 1. It is a holy day of
obligation for Catholics, meaning that Mass attendance is
required. The use of the word “Solemnity” here is a
designation used for certain days within the liturgical (church-
based) calendar of the Church. Solemnities are the highest rank
of liturgical celebration, higher than feast days or memorials.
By celebrating a solemnity dedicated to Mary’s motherhood,
the Church highlights the significance of her part in the life of
Jesus, and emphasizes that He is both human and divine.
Jesus’ nature as both and equally human and divine is
something we may take for granted today. But back in the early
days of the church, this dogma of our faith was hotly debated.
In 431 A.D. during the Council of Ephesus, the title of “Mary
Mother of God,” in Greek “Theotokus,” was defended and
defined against the heresy of Nestorius. Nestorius, Bishop of
Constantinople, refuted the title of “Theotokus” claiming that
Christ had two loosely united natures, and therefore, Mary was
only the mother of the human part of Him.
