Christ the Lord raised marriage between the baptized to the dignity of a sacrament* (cf. CIC, can. 1055 § 1; cf. GS 48 § 1).” (CCC 1660)

THE FEAST OF OUR LADY OF LOURDES is Tuesday February 11.
