**MARKED AND UNMARKED PEWS** - During the Covid pandemic, each parish has had to become a bit creative in their attempts to maintain recommended social distancing. When you come to Holy Name for Mass, be sure to check the main aisle where you will find the signage indicating which pew to sit in on that given day. The pews are either “marked” or “unmarked.” Pews that are marked will have a cross designed in gold, black, and purple colors which will be taped on the end of the pew. Unmarked pews are unmarked. The catch is that the pews have been divided in half. (There is a noticeable wooden partition in each pew to divide it.) What this means is that only half of the pew is available for seating on any given day. If you enter a “marked” pew from the center aisle, the other half of that pew is an “unmarked” pew from the side aisle. Please take a moment to familiarize yourself with this “system,” so that you will be sitting in the correct pew. We are grateful for your cooperation during this challenging time.

**LENTEN REMINDERS!** – \*All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. \*Confessions are heard at Holy Name, Sun.-Fri. for one hour before the 5:30 PM Mass, and Saturday, 11 AM – 12 PM. \*The Stations of the Cross are prayed every Friday, immediately following the 5:30 PM Mass.
