THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD



The word “epiphany” comes from the Greek *epiphainen*, a verb that means “to shine upon,” “to manifest,” or “to make known.” What the Church celebrates today is the manifestation of our Lord to the whole world; after being made known to the shepherds of Bethlehem He is revealed to the Magi who have come from the East to adore Him. Christian tradition has ever seen in the Magi the first fruits of the Gentiles; they lead in their wake all the peoples of the earth, and thus the Epiphany is an affirmation of universal salvation. The Church extends itself on Epiphany to the homes of the faithful. The custom of blessing the home on this day probably originated from these words in the Gospel, “And entering into the house, they found the Child with Mary, His Mother, and falling down they adored Him.” The priest blesses the house if he can be present, but if not, the father of the family does so.

ACCORDING TO THE CHURCH, the Christmas season officially ends with the Baptism of the Lord, observed this year on January 12. So *Merry Christmas*, and keep those decorations up one more week to help the world know that the birth of the Savior of the world, is worth celebrating a long time!

THE MONTH OF JANUARY is traditionally dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus. This feast is celebrated on January 3. The name Jesus was given to the holy child at God's command (Luke 1:31). The Holy Name is all-powerful because of the person who bears it; we honor it because of the command of Christ, that we should pray in His name and because it reminds us of all the blessings we receive through our Holy Redeemer. Hence St. Paul was able to write to the Philippians: “. . . At the name of Jesus every knee should bend of those in heaven, on earth, and under the earth” (Phil. 2:10). By means of this devotion we also make amends for *improper* use of the Holy Name. (catholicculture.org) The feast of the Holy Name of Jesus is also special for our parish as its namesake.
