### JANUARY- DEVOTION TO THE HOLY NAME OF

It's a shame that the name of Jesus, so powerful and salvific, is so often invoked in vain or in blasphemy. Be vigilant that you and your family avoid making this mistake yourselves. Whenever you hear the name of Jesus said in vain or blasphemed, make up for the sacrilege by praising the name of Jesus either in your heart, or even better, out loud. *"For this reason also, God highly exalted Him, and bestowed on Him the name which is above every name, so that at the name of JESUS every knee will bow, of those who are in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and that every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."* (Philippians 2:9-11)
