A CHANGE IN HOLY COMMUNION AT HOLY NAME
Father Antonio will distribute Holy Communion at the altar rail to the left of the altar (the side where the statue of Our Blessed Mother resides). At your own discretion, you may receive either kneeling or standing, on the tongue or in the hand at the communion rail. Please remember to keep a 6 foot distance between you and the person in front of you. Please wear your mask and remove only at the altar rail for reception of Holy Communion. All these changes can be very distracting. The most important thing to recollect as you approach for Holy Communion is: **“Dominus Est” - It is the Lord!**

*I am the living bread that came down from heaven;
whoever eats this bread will live forever;
and the bread that I will give
is my flesh for the life of the world.
(John 6:51)*

Please remember all priests (living and deceased) and our seminarians in your prayers - that they will remain faithful, holy, pure, and prayerful. Continue to pray for an increase of vocations to the

priesthood and religious life.
