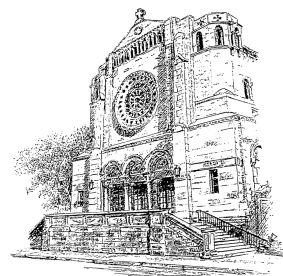

A CHANGE IN HOLY COMMUNION AT HOLY NAME Father Antonio will distribute Holy Communion at the altar rail to the left of the altar (the side where the statue of Our Blessed Mother resides). At your own discretion, you may receive either kneeling or standing, on the tongue or in the hand at the communion rail. Please remember to keep a 6 foot distance between you and the person in front of you. Please wear your mask and remove only at the altar rail for reception of Holy Communion. All these changes can be very distracting. The most important thing to recollect as you approach for Holy Communion is: **“Dominus Est” - It is the Lord!**

*Glory to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit;

EXPOSITION/ADORATION AND CONFESSION – Holy Name offers Exposition and Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament, Monday through Friday, 4:30-5:30 PM. The Blessed Sacrament will then be reposed and daily Mass will begin. at 5:30. Confessions will be heard from 4:30 – 5:30 PM Monday – Friday.

THE MONTH OF JUNE IS DEVOTED TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS. The Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on the Friday following the second Sunday after Pentecost. (This year, June 19) Love has always been associated with the heart, so it was only natural that the love of God became represented by a heart, the heart of his Son Jesus. The *Catechism*, quoting Pope Pius XII’s beautiful encyclical on the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, *Haurietis Aquas* (1956), states, “[Jesus] has loved us all with a human heart. For this reason, the Sacred Heart of Jesus, pierced by our sins and for our salvation, ‘is quite rightly considered the chief sign and symbol of that... love with which the divine Redeemer continually loves the eternal Father and all human beings’ without exception.
