Many Catholic sites have book suggestions for Lenten reading. 5) Give up a favorite food, beverage, or condiment. 6) Read the Gospel for the day 7) Volunteer at a soup kitchen, pantry, or nursing home 8) Pray the Rosary daily, or a decade each day 9) Get up a few minutes early, kneel down and pray a morning offering. 10) Give up Netflix! 11) Wear a crucifix 12) Listen to Catholic radio in your car – 820 AM 13) Use Operation Rice Bowl to donate to those in need 14) Read/Listen to a biography of a saint. 15) Invite someone to dinner. 16) **Go to Confession!**

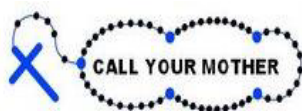
### LENTEN OPPORTUNITIES AT HOLY NAME.

**THE MONTH OF MARCH** is traditionally devoted to **St. Joseph**. Throughout the Gospels, St. Joseph remains silent, but his actions speak louder than words. He lives his life in service to Christ and Mary, in perfect conformity to the will of God. "The Prayer for Conformity to the Will of God" asks St. Joseph to pray for you, so that you may live the life that God wills you to live.

*Great St. Joseph, to whose will the Savior subjected himself, obtain for me the grace to subject myself in all things to the will of God. Through the merits you obtained when in the darkness of night you obeyed the angel's commands, ask for me this grace, that nothing may detain me from fulfilling the will of God with perfect conformity. In the stable of Bethlehem, on the flight to Egypt, you recommended yourself and those dear to you to divine providence. Ask for me this same grace to conform myself to the will of God in discouragement and despondency, in health and sickness, in happiness and misfortune, in success and failure so that nothing may disturb the tranquility of my soul in obediently following the way of God for me.
