COMMON SENSE PRECAUTIONS FOR ILLNESS -

When you're ill or even experiencing symptoms of illness, please remember that you are not obliged to attend Mass. And, in fact, in a spirit of charity, you should not attend Mass or any other functions. Please take proper measures to practice good hygiene and wash your hands frequently. (We are advised to wash our hands for 20 seconds. One "Hail Mary" recited slowly is about 20 seconds!). Individuals may choose to omit shaking hands at the sign of peace, and simply turn to those nearby to say, "Peace be with you."

LENTEN OPPORTUNITIES AT HOLY NAME.

Confessions: Sat. 11:00 AM to 12 PM, and from Sunday through Friday, they are heard one hour before the 5:30 Mass.
Stations of the Cross will be prayed every Friday immediately following the 5:30 PM Mass. **The Rosary** is prayed at 5 PM every Sunday in the Holy Name Church Chapel. **Adoration with Exposition** is offered at Holy Name on Fridays from 4:30 PM – 5:30 PM and on Saturdays after the 8:30 AM Mass. Please take advantage of these precious opportunities to enhance your Lent and bring you close to our Lord.

A REMINDER... Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. (These norms are applicable from age 18-59.) Abstinence is the denying of oneself meat at all meals that day.
