IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM THE DIOCESE OF COLUMBUS

Regular Confession times and public daily Mass will begin May 25, with Public Sunday Mass to begin May 30-31. Bishop Brennan dispenses the Catholic faithful of the Diocese of Columbus, from Sunday obligation until September 13. The Diocese has offered these guidelines as we return to worship our Lord and Savior in the Most Holy Eucharist. (The Diocesan guidelines will be available in full on our website: www.holynamercc.info)

Those attending Mass are asked to:

* wear a cloth face covering unless under age of 2. Should be removed right before receiving our Lord in Holy Communion and then should be placed back on the face.

* maintain physical distancing of 6 feet in the pews and as you approach for Holy Communion. Members of families are not bound by distancing

* maintain hand hygiene – bringing own sanitizer is recommended.

You may also notice some physical changes at church as well. Unfortunately, the guidelines recommend that we remain without our Holy Water fonts. Priests and Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers will be wearing masks during communion. Music will be limited. There will be no offertory procession. The distribution from the chalice is omitted. The sign of peace will be omitted. Hand sanitizers will be available at the entrances to the church as well as in the sanctuary. **We ask your help as we provide disposable disinfectant wipes for you to wipe down surfaces you may have touched during Mass.** The church itself will incur a deep cleaning and disinfecting before Mass. The doors to the church will be propped open for those entering church. Our missalette will be removed from the church. There will be a “greeter” at the front doors to remind you to wear masks, to social distance, and of some of the other changes. We may also be utilizing tape on the floor or pews for a visual to help maintain social distance of 6 feet in the pew and the aisle for Holy Communion.

Lots of changes, but one thing is constant. Jesus Christ is the same, yesterday, today and forever. (Hebrews 13:8) He is here waiting for you in this church. In the most Holy Eucharist, you experience a union like no other in the created world. Please remember to give thanks to God today for the great gift of once again experiencing union with Him. May God bless you and may Our Lady’s mantle of protection be over you always.



A CHANGE IN HOLY COMMUNION AT HOLY NAME

This week at Holy Name Church we began to once again utilize the communion rail as the place where we reverently receive Our Lord. Father Antonio will distribute Holy Communion at the altar rail to the left of the altar (the side where the statue of Our Blessed Mother resides). At your own discretion, you may receive either kneeling or standing, on the tongue or in the hand at the communion rail. Please remember to keep a 6 foot distance between you and the person in front of you. Please wear your mask and remove only at the altar rail for reception of Holy Communion. All these changes can be very distracting. The most important thing to recollect as you approach for Holy Communion is:

“Dominus Est” - It is the Lord!



EXPOSITION/ADORATION AND CONFESSION –

During each week, Monday thru Friday, Exposition and Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament will take place in Holy Name Church from 4:30 PM – 5:30 PM. The Blessed Sacrament will then be reposed and daily Mass will begin. Confessions will be heard from 4:30 – 5:30 PM Monday – Friday.
