SECOND COLLECTION TODAY - American Catholics will have a rare opportunity this weekend to offer charitable support for pastoral care to the faithful in the United States Military and the nation's Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) Medical Centers through the 2nd collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services (AMS). This special collection for the AMS is taken only once every three years with the approval of the USCCB. Thank you for your prayers and donation.

The AMS was established by Pope Saint John Paul II in 1985 to provide the Catholic Church's full range of programs, pastoral service, and liturgical celebrations to Catholics in the U.S. Armed Forces. The mission of the Archdiocese is to "serve those who serve," specifically, those who serve in uniform on active duty or reserve, study to be officers in the U.S. Military Academies, receive treatment at many of the 153 VA Medical Centers throughout the fifty states, Puerto Rico and Guam, or work in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders, and the families of these populations. All told, 1.8 million American Catholics worldwide depend on the AMS and its bishops, endorsed chaplains, deacons, and lay leaders for their spiritual care and free exercise of faith.

THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER There's only one door out of purgatory for the Holy Souls there. It opens only into heaven. But here's the catch: they can't open it themselves. We have to open it for them. Here are a two easy ways to help a soul in Purgatory. The first way is to attend Mass for the Holy Souls. Have a Mass offered for a departed soul. Then there is the St. Gertrude Prayer specifically to release souls from purgatory: *"Eternal Father I offer you the most precious blood of your divine son Jesus, in union with all the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the holy souls in purgatory, for sinners everywhere, sinners in the Universal Church, those in my own home and within my family. Amen."*
