OCTOBER IS RESPECT LIFE MONTH – Jesus calls each of us to “*care for the other as a person for whom God has made us responsible*” (EV 87). The Gospel of life is intrinsic to the whole Christian life and foundational to the decisions we make on a daily basis. For, “*the Gospel of God’s love for man, the Gospel of the dignity of the person and the Gospel of life are a single and indivisible Gospel*” (EV 2, emphasis added). In his encyclical on the Gospel of life, Pope St. John Paul II recognizes the full range of threats against human life, from poverty and malnutrition to murder and war. He places particular emphasis, however, on threats to life at its beginning and end—precisely when it is most in need of protection. In modern times, children in their mothers’ wombs and those approaching the end of their lives are certainly among the “least of these” in our world’s estimation. Practices such as abortion and assisted suicide tragically reject the truth that human life is always to be cherished and defended with loving concern.

OCTOBER IS DESIGNATED as the Month of the Rosary. The Rosary is Christocentric setting forth the entire life of Jesus Christ, the passion, death, resurrection and glory. Of course, the Rosary honors and contemplates Mary too, and rightly so, for the same reason that the Liturgical Year does likewise: "Because of the mission she received from God, her life is most closely linked with the mysteries of Jesus Christ, and there is no one who has followed in the footsteps of the Incarnate Word more closely and with more merit than she" 142 (*Mediator Dei*). Meditation on this cycle of Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious and Luminous Mysteries makes the Rosary not only "a breviary or summary of the Gospel and of Christian life," (*Ingravescentibus malis*) but also a compendium of the Liturgical Year. Therewith the Rosary stands revealed as a dynamic teacher and nurturer of Christian faith, morality, and spiritual perfection, fostering in various ways faith, hope, charity, and the other virtues, and mediating special graces, all to the end that we may become more and more like unto Christ. — *Mariology*, Juniper B. Carol, O.F.M.

NEW DISCERNMENT GROUPS AT ST. BRENDAN - *With the help of the Director of Vocations we are happy to bring two new exciting projects to our deanery of parishes. Both are designed for young men and women 16 through mid-twenties. The groups help them discern whether the Priesthood or Religious Life is something that God is calling them to. Both will take place at St. Brendan in Hilliard.*

The Melchizedek Project is for young men. It is a national initiative and we are the third place to offer this group in the diocese. The meetings will be once a month. Every other month Fr Hahn, the Vocations Director will join us. Other priests may also drop in. It will take place in our new meeting Room B, every 1st Thursday of the month at 6:30 PM and will last an hour. Masks will be required and social distancing maintained.

The AVOW discernment group for young women discerning religious life follows the same format and meets on the same night but in Room A. Food will be available, and the meetings will run from 6:30 PM to 7:30 PM. The Polish Dominican sisters will be part of these meetings, as well as one or two lay volunteers.
