AS CATHOLICS APPROACH THE POLLS, we are asked to weigh many important issues. The U.S. bishops and Pope Francis have reaffirmed that “the threat of abortion remains our preeminent priority because it directly attacks life itself, because it takes place within the sanctuary of the family, and because of the number of lives destroyed.* We do not dismiss or ignore other threats to human life and dignity, but absolute priority is given to upholding and defending our brothers’ and sisters’ most basic right—to live. (**Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*)

OCTOBER IS RESPECT LIFE MONTH – “Governments and international institutions promote abortion and euthanasia as marks of progress and freedom. But this is a false and perverse understanding in which freedom is equated with absolute individualism. True freedom is inherently relational, recognizing that God has entrusted us to one another. As cultures and societies fail to recognize these objective truths, everything becomes relative and all principles are called into question—even the fundamental right to life. However, the blood of Christ’s sacrifice remains our constant hope. Christ’s gift of himself on the cross reveals how precious life truly is and gives us the strength to commit ourselves to building a *culture of life*. Christ’s blood, shed for us, promises that in God’s plan death will be no more, and life will be victorious.” (Evangelium vitae (The Gospel of Life) Pope St. John Paul II)

OCTOBER IS DESIGNATED as the Month of the Rosary.

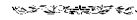
