OCTOBER IS DEDICATED as the Month of the Rosary because we celebrate the memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary each year on October 7. The memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary came about this way: Troops of the Turkish Ottoman Empire had invaded and occupied the Byzantine empire by 1453, bringing a large portion of the Christian world under a version of Islamic law. For the next hundred years, the Turks expanded their empire westward on land, and asserted their naval power in the Mediterranean. In 1570, the Turks were threatening to invade Rome and captured Cyprus.

The next year, three Catholic powers on the continent – Genoa, Spain, and the Papal States - formed an alliance called the Holy League, to defend their Christian civilization against Turkish invasion. Its fleets sailed to confront the Turks near the west coast of Greece on October 7, 1571. A battle which became known as The Battle of Lepanto.

Crew members on more than 200 ships prayed the Rosary in preparation for the battle - as did Christians throughout Europe, encouraged by the Pope to gather in their churches to invoke the Virgin Mary against the daunting Turkish forces.

At Battles end, all but 13 of the nearly 300 Turkish ships had been captured or sunk. The Pope understood the significance the Rosary had played in this victory and was moved to institute the feast now celebrated universally as Our Lady of the Rosary. (Catholicnewsagency.com)
