Given the sexual misconduct scandals in certain corners of the Church, the annual Cathedral pilgrimage to Our Lady of Consolation Shrine is focused this year on one of reparation, with a special Rosary and Mass of Reparation, along with the other devotions provided by the Franciscan Friars at the Shrine. A number of Shrine devotions are also part of this pilgrimage.

ROSARY COAST TO COAST! - In 2017, the Church in Poland gathered around the borders of their country to light a spiritual flame, a flame that quickly engulfed the nation in prayer and reparation. Shortly after, the sparks from this conflagration of the Holy Spirit spread, to Ireland and the British Isles. Now the United States is being called upon to do the same at this critical moment in history — to pray at rallies coast-to-coast on Oct. 7. “We are being called upon to help turn our country back towards God. We must acknowledge as a people that we have turned away from God; we’ve allowed the kingdom of Satan to assault us, we must confess our errors, turn away from the darkness, and repair what we as a Church and as a nation, have wrought,” Prayer will change hearts, change families, change our communities, change our country and change the world. This is a WORLD WIDE EFFORT to combat the Powers of Darkness—the Powers that seek to stifle the Light. Rosaries are encouraged to take place on Sunday Oct. 7th, at 4pm eastern, 3pm central, 2pm mountain, 1pm pacific

THE MONTH OF OCTOBER is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. The history of the Rosary is not well known even in Catholic circles and is closely tied to the Psalms. The 150 Davidic Psalms (the Psalter of David) have always been prayed by Old Testament Israel, post-Temple Jews, and by Christians for personal prayer, communal prayer, lamentations, praise, thanksgiving, and, in the case of Christians, to demonstrate the fulfillment of prophecy. They came to form a large part of the Divine Office sung at the various canonical hours by religious. Lay people who didn't have copies of Scripture or the Breviary and those who were illiterate would substitute 150 Pater Nosters (Our Fathers) or Aves (Hail Marys) in place of the 150 Psalms they could not read. The prayers were originally counted by transferring pebbles from one bag to another, but soon enough Christians began to tie a rope with knots on which to count. This evolved further into using beads or pieces of wood in place of the knots, and this soon came to be called the "Psalter of the Laity." Around the end of the first millennium, Rosaries contained the present five decades (sets of ten beads), with the Ave beads shaped like white lilies for the purity of the Virgin, and the Pater beads shaped like red roses for the wounds and Passion of Christ. St. Dominic de Guzman popularized the Marian Psalter in the form we have it today (150 Aves with a Pater after each 10) when Our Lady encouraged him to pray it that way in response to the Albigensian heresy. (So associated with the Rosary is St. Dominic that the Rosary is often called the "Dominican Rosary.") The Rosary, thus, has always been prayed as both weapon against heresy and also during difficult times in the Church. In fact, on October 7, 1571 Christendom was victorious over Islamic warriors at the Battle of Lepanto. This victory was attributed directly to the Rosaries prayed by the faithful. Thus, we celebrate The Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary annually on October 7. (fisheaters.com)
